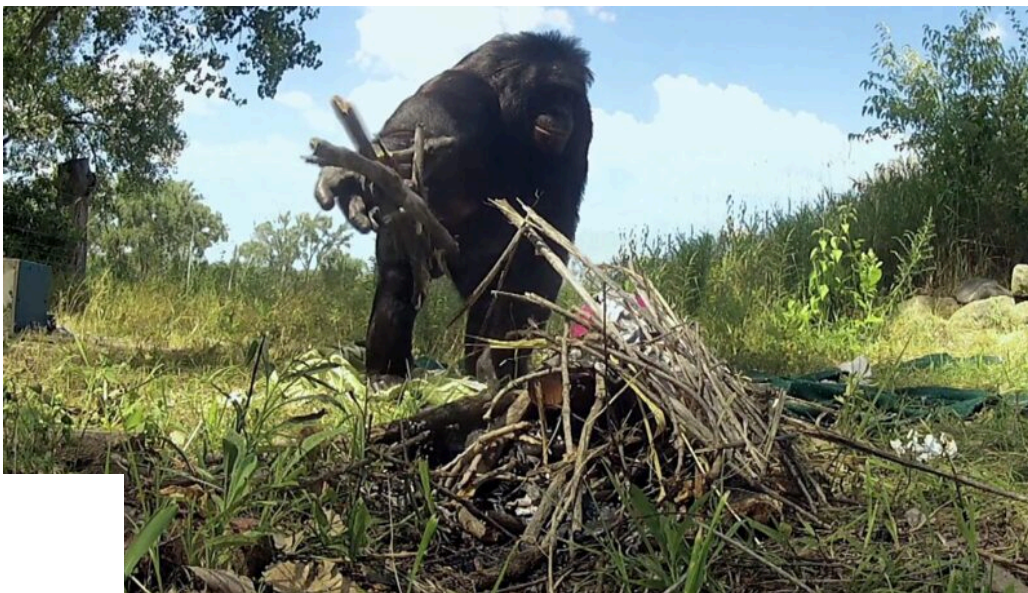
Rewrite the sentence below, using alternative adjectives to those underlined.
