Badgers are <u>nocturnal</u> creatures, emerging at night to forage for worms, insects and small mammals. They have <u>poor</u> eyesight but rely on their keen sense of smell to locate food in the dark. During the day, they retreat to <u>underground</u> burrows called setts, which they dig using their strong claws. These setts can be <u>complex</u> tunnel systems, often shared by <u>multiple</u> generations.
